Course Content

This course covers the skills and knowledge to recognise, treat and mitigate the risks of anaphylaxis.

Topics include:

- Triggers, signs and symptoms of mild to moderate allergic reactions and anaphylaxis
- Emergency response to anaphylaxis, including ASCIA action plans.
- Use of adrenaline autoinjector devices
- Communicating details to emergency services and incident reporting procedures
- Evaluating the response to an anaphylaxis incident
- Development of individual anaphylaxis management plans
- Risk assessment for allergies
- Implementation of strategies to minimise allergic reaction risk
- Development of communication
