Course Overview

This course contains the knowledge and skills to provide an advanced first aid response in the event of an emergency. It is relevant for personnel who may be required to provide, coordinate and manage a first aid response across a range of complex situations, including community and workplace settings.

Duration

This is a blended course with self-paced e-Learning and face-to-face training and assessment. Before attending for face-to-face, students will need to complete their e-Learning.

Course Content

This course covers the provision of advanced first aid response, life support, management of casualties, the incident and other first aiders, until the arrival of medical or other assistance.

Topics Include:

- Cardiopulmonary resuscitation techniques
- Safe use of an Automated External Defibrillator (AED)
- Bleeding, fractures, burns and other trauma
- Eve and soft tissue injuries
- Envenomation / Poisoning
- Substance abuse (drugs and alcohol)
- Hyperthermia and hypothermia
- Treatment of minor wounds
- Infection control procedures
- Management of life-threatening bleeding
- Medical conditions (asthma. diabetes...)
- Assessment of vital signs
- Coordinating first aid activities
- Triage of multiple casualties
- Evaluation of response to critical incidents
- Verbal and written reports of the incident
- Legislative requirements in first aid
- Psychological impacts of first aid incidents

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Assessment Methods

Online theory assessments and face-to-face practical assessment.

Note: the provision of Adult and Child CPR must be demonstrated on the floor.

Course Materials

Training is supported through the provision of quality learning materials and resources.

Students undertaking this short course should wear comfortable, casual clothing. This course will include activities such as bending, kneeling and lying on the floor. Students will also require access to a computer or tablet with internet connection to complete the theory component of the course.
